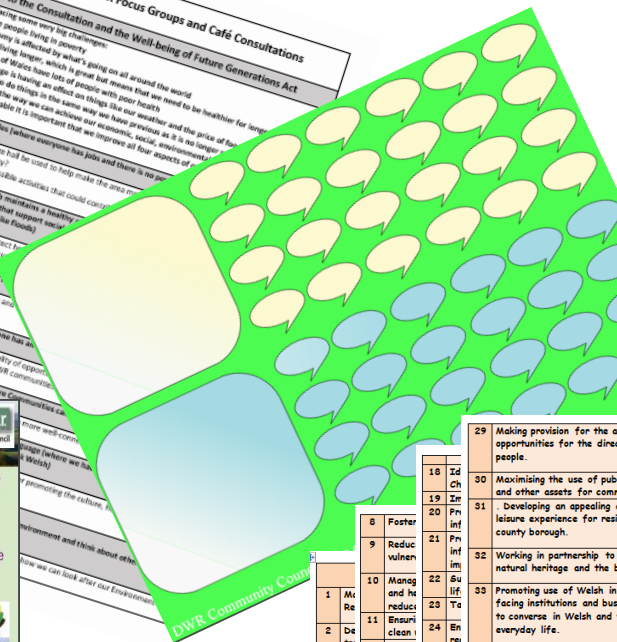
Introduction to the Consultation and the Well-being of Future Generations Act

Our country is facing some very big challenges:

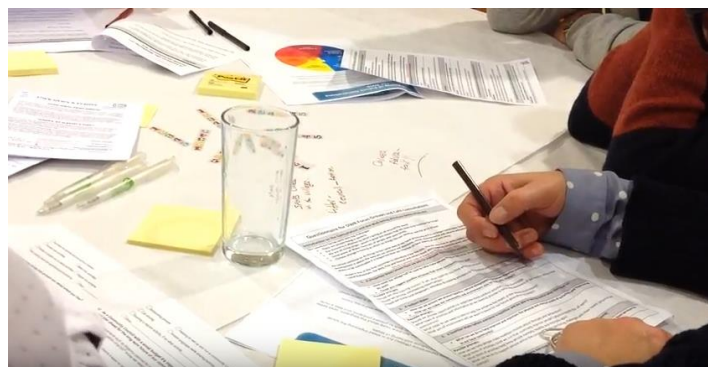
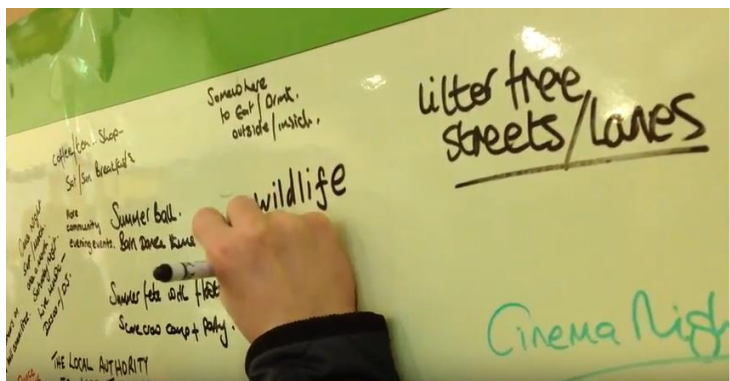
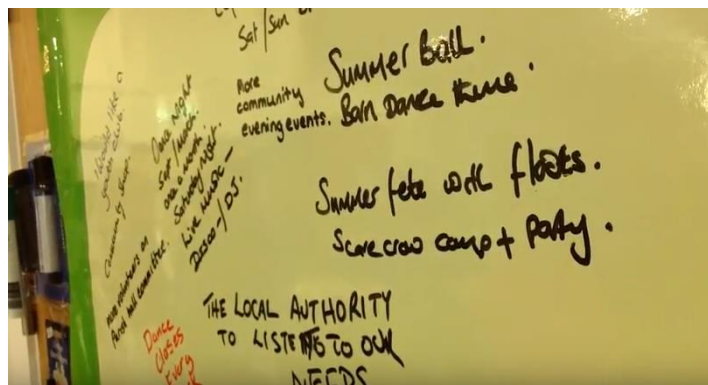
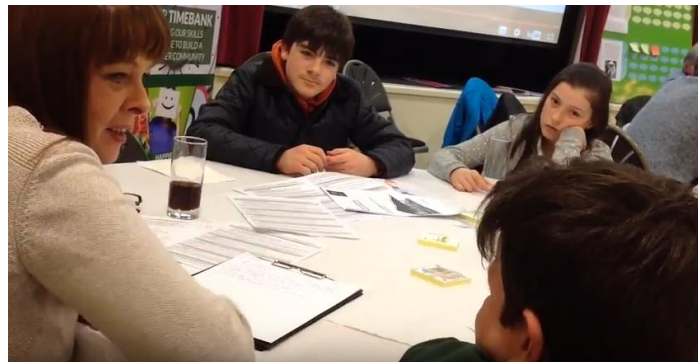
- There are people living in poverty

- Climate change is having an effect on things like our weather and the price of food

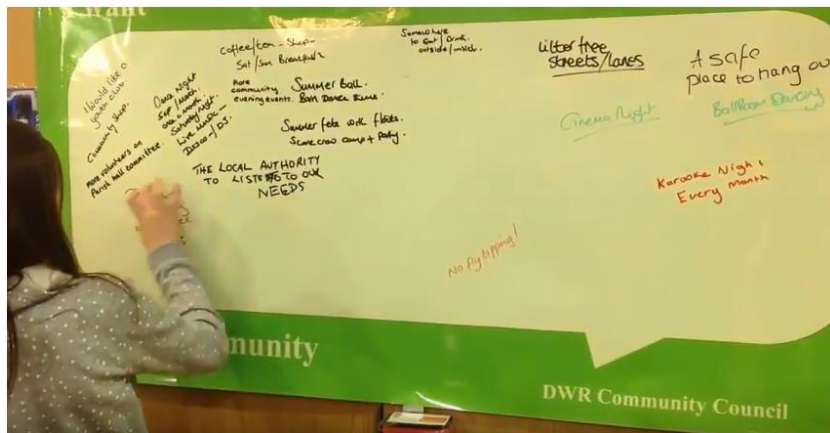
We cannot continue to do things in the same way we have previously as it is no longer sustainable. It is important that we improve all four aspects of our lives.
